<p>In the morning we head to the Valle Alto (high valley), where our trip takes us to the rural roots of Cochabamba's society. In the villages of the area we will be able to appreciate living traditions, colonial and religious architecture, farmers' markets and a lot more.</p> <p>Our visit begins in the small colonial town of Tarata, which was once the capital of Bolivia. We visit the church (depending on its irregular opening hours) and the Franciscan convent. Then we go on to the village of Huayculi, where the thousand years old tradition of pottery is kept alive, and visit a potter's workshop. Then we go to the village of Cliza to have lunch.</p> <p>In the afternoon we head to Punata, then to the village of Arani with its church that reflects the richness and great artistic variety of the colonial era. To finish the tour we visit Collpa Ciaco convent and return to Cochabamba.</p> <p>End of the tour, transfer to the hotel or airport.</p>

On **Tuesdays** the tour starts in Punata for a visit to the local farmer's market and ends in Tarata. On **Sundays** we can visit the farmer's market in Cliza.
